Kesar sweetly pulls South Gujarat farmers away from alphonso's tangy charm



SURAT: Hafoos or alphonso mangoes have undisputedly ruled South Gujarat taste buds down the ages. Kesar, growing abundantly in the neighbouring Saurashtra region, till some time ago, was never considered a competitor in matters of preference here.

However, of late, the globally popular tangy-sweet hafoos seems to have lost favour with Valsad and Navsari mango farmers. They are now drawn by the alluring sweetness of the irresistible kesar variety, not just for its taste but also for the sustainable income.

Every year, the average plantation of kesar variety is increasing by 500 hectares in Valsad, while that of hafoos and other varieties has been

cut to only 10 percent of the farms. In Valsad, of a total 37,344 hectares of mango farms, only around 30 percent of land is for hafoos plantation. It has reduced significantly from 50 percent around 10 years ago. A majority of land in farms is reserved for kesar mango, while remaining is for hafoos and some lesser-known local varieties.

The second biggest farm area under mango cultivation in South Gujarat is in Navsari district. In Navsari, of 33,945 hectares, total mango plantations, around 27,076 hectare are kesar farms. While in Surat district, around 7,696 hectares out of total 9,620 hectares mango farm area are for kesar plantations.

"Alphonso's vulnerability to weather and diseases is the major reason behind its drop in farming. Hafoos also requires better care and many farmers do not wish to invest so much time these days," Nikunj Patel, deputy director, horticulture, Valsad, told TOI. Patel added that the average annual yield of kesar mango is around 500 tonnes, hafoos is now planted in only 10 percent area. Per hectare, the production in Valsad annually is around six tonnes.

Manager of a mango farm in Umargam, Ramesh Parmar had planted 1,800 kesar mango and 300 alphonso saplings a year ago. While the valuation of hafoos is highest in the market, its fruit bearing starts only on alternate years.

Kesar is preferred by farmers now due to regular income," explained Parmar, who too has planted kesar variety on his own farm in Chikhli as well. "Due to its spongy tissue as well as drop in production owing to uncertain weather, farmers in Navsari and Surat have switched to kesar which occupies around 80% of the total land under mango farming," said Dinesh Padaliya, deputy director, horticulture, Navsari and Surat.

Heart attacks more frequent when heat, humidity high: Study



AHMEDABAD: Increased temperatures and humidity cause a spike in heart attacks in Ahmedabad, according to a recently published study. While it is believed that heart attacks spike in the winter, extreme weather had the same effect, according to the findings of the study, primarily for younger people.

The study, 'Impact of atmospheric variables on incidence of acute coronary syndrome amongst Gujarati Asian Indians - IOAPIC study' was published in the Indian Heart Journal by Elsevier recently, and its authors included Dr Kamal Sharma, a city-based cardiologist, and Ashwati Konat and Divya Chandel from the zoology department of Gujarat University.

The study analysed data of 3,256 patients from two hospitals from 2017 to 2019. The data of 740 patients was further analysed against factors like maximum and minimum temperatures, humidity and atmospheric pressure. The findings indicated that 34% or about one-third of the total cases were recorded in August and September months.

Dr Sharma said many studies correlating major heart attacks - specifically ST-elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI), - with the cold were conducted in the west. "But in cities like Ahmedabad that see prolonged period of elevated temperatures, we wanted to see how factors like temperature and humidity, set to increase with climate change, affect cardiac health," he said. The researchers extrapolated the data of patients with major heart attacks with weather parameters. A pattern emerged. A rise in both temperatures and humidity were found to have caused a higher number of cases. About 80% of the cases were of STEMI.

Dr Sharma said a possible explanation is loss of water due to humidity. "Due to perspiration we lose water, which can affect viscosity of blood. Months of high instances had increased humidity with temperatures not falling much. The most affected age group was 60 to 70 years. We should create awareness about staying hydrated and rest risk," he said. Dr Jayesh Rawal, a cardiologist, said the findings match the experience in hospital settings. "People arrive with acute pain, perspiration and agony, which is found to be a heart attack. These patients often need stenting or angioplasty."

Gujarat's car sales growth zooms past national average



AHMEDABAD: Be it festive sentiment or ease of supply constraints, the growth in sale of cars in Gujarat has certainly outperformed the national average. While passenger vehicle sales in the country posted a marginal decrease of 1.35% in April with 2.82 lakh units being retailed during the month, in Gujarat PV sales posted a 7% growth at 28,597 units retailed, according to data compiled by Federation of Automobile Dealers' Association (FADA).

Hitendra Nanavati, chairman of the FADA Gujarat chapter, said, "Gujarat showed an overall growth of 4% in April, against the same month last year. This is significant since many other states have shown a marginal decrease. Thanks to the consistent positive sentiments prevailing across the state, overall vehicle sale remained upbeat here." The sale was mainly driven by bookings on Akshaya Tritiya and an overall positive sentiment among buyers. "Premium hatchback and SUVs were in good demand during the month. Bookings on Akshaya Tritiya supported the overall numbers. However, supply side constraints continue to remain and had marginally eased during the festive muhurat on account of which sales remained good," said a city-based car dealer. Dealers had offered a

marginally up as compared to last year.

Referring to the near-term outlook, FADA projects that the two-wheeler segment may continue facing challenges with entry-level vehicles attracting fewer buyers. "FADA urges the GST Council to consider reducing GST on 2-wheelers from 28% to 18% to help revive this vital segment, which represents 75% of total auto sales volume. On the other hand, the marriage season in May is expected to bring about a sales resurgence, driven by an increase in customer inquiries. Additionally, as electric vehicles (EVs) gain popularity, customers are increasingly considering transitioning from internal combustion engines (ICE) to EVs, which may temporarily delay purchasing decisions," according to FADA.

Third school files extortion FIR against YouTuber

AHMEDABAD: A trustee of a Satellite school on Thursday filed a complaint with city crime branch against Ashish Kanjaria, the operator of a YouTube channel, 'Po Khol', for allegedly extorting Rs 6 lakh from the school and Rs 2 lakh from the brother of the trustee, a businessman. Investigators say the accused has extorted Rs 1.5 crore from various schools and companies. CID registered a complaint under IPC Sections 384 (extortion), 389 (putting

person in fear of accusation of offence, in order to commit extortion) and 507 (criminal intimidation by anonymous communication) against Kanjaria. This is the third FIR against him by a school in the last two weeks. Crime branch officials said they sought details from the charity commissioner about Aadhaar Foundation run by Kanjaria, and information from the company's CID registered complaint under IPC Section 384. "So far, Kanjaria deposited Rs 35 lakh in cash into the account of an entity he

was running called 'Corporate Online'. He has received Rs 1.15 crore from educational institutions and companies in the state," a crime branch official said. The FIR was filed against him by the school of the three trustees of Anand Niketan School in Satellite, in his complaint stated Kanjaria was known for organizing dharnas to protest government decisions and against schools. He said Kanjaria came to their school in Gandhinagar and threatened his friend's son. Mangal said he obliged him but it later emerged that Kanjaria had taken Rs 2 lakh from the child's parents for it.

One Covid death, 73 new cases in Gujarat



AHMEDABAD: On the day the World Health Organization (WHO) said that Covid-19 no longer qualifies as a global health emergency, active case tally continued its decline in Gujarat. Against 73 new cases, the state recorded discharge of 179 patients, taking the active cases to 643.

The state however recorded the death of a Covid patient in Valsad, taking the death toll to 11,075. Three patients were on ventilators.

Ahmedabad city recorded 22 new cases on Friday, followed by seven in Mehsana and six each in Vadodara city and Surat.

Man clubbed to death in Gandhinagar

AHMEDABAD: Four men including a father-son duo allegedly clubbed a 66-year-old man to death in Nardipur village of Kalol taluka of Gandhinagar on Saturday evening over a dispute of peeing in open. Kalol taluka police have registered a complaint of murder, criminal intimidation and abetment against Dashrath Thakor and three others. The deceased, Jawanji Thakor, was attending a marriage of his elder brother's daughter when the accused Dashrath Thakor, his father Babu Thakor and two others, Anand Thakor and Shallesh Thakor, attacked him. Earlier on Friday, Dashrath had a brawl with Jawanji's son Arvind over peeing in open near Arvind's sister's house in Nardipur. "I spotted Dashrath peeing in front of my sister's place. So, I objected to it and told him not to indulge in such indecent act. Dashrath started fighting with me. My family members intervened and sent him away," said Arvind in his FIR. On Saturday evening, when Dashrath was at a wedding and Jawanji was sitting outside his brother's house, Dashrath and three others came with rods, sticks and blunt objects. Kalol taluka police have registered a complaint of murder, criminal intimidation and abetment against Dashrath Thakor and three others. Earlier on Friday, Dashrath had a brawl with Jawanji's son Arvind over peeing in open near Arvind's sister's house in Nardipur. "I spotted Dashrath peeing in front of my sister's place. Kalol taluka of Gandhinagar on Saturday evening over a dispute of peeing in open. Plea in Gujarat HC seeks midterm admissions after children turn six

AHMEDABAD: The Gujarat HC on Wednesday sought the state government's reply to a petition challenging education authorities' decision to not grant admission to Class 1 until the child has completed six years of age.

The petitioner is seeking admission of her child after the coming academic session begins, as the child does not turn six by cutoff date, June 1. She demanded that the child be admitted midterm after turning six. The state government introduced minimum age of six for Class 1 admission this academic year, citing Right to Education Act and guidelines issued under the New Education Policy. The petitioner's son is 21 days short of turning six on June 1, the cutoff date set by the government. The petitioner's advocate cited Section 3 of RTE Act, which mandates that the state government admit a child between 6 and 14 years of age to the primary section. The petitioner's advocate, Dilip Prajapati, cited Section 3 of the RTE Act, which mandates that the state government admit a child between 6 and 14 years of age to the primary section either at the start of the academic session or at any time of the year. He also relied on Section 15, which says that no child can be denied admission to primary school. He submitted that setting the cutoff date at June 1 violates multiple provisions of the law, as a child can be admitted to school throughout the academic year. The petitioner's lawyer gave the example of the sixth month extension granted for Class 1 admissions, but the government lawyer clarified that this was based on a notification from the Centre, where admission up to six months late can be granted to children in cases of illness or migration.
